**If you were asked to describe the County's Agricultural Reserve to someone, what would you say?**  
approximately 90,000 acres of land set aside in 1980 for protection from development, maintained for agriculture.

**What is your vision for the future of the County's Agricultural Reserve?**

We need to work with farmers to ensure their business model remains viable. We should promote Montgomery County agricultural products, develop farm-to-table programs and work with public schools to teach county students about agriculture and the benefits of eating fresh produce.

County schools are not especially interested in working with outside groups. Children of farm families often aren't interested in pursuing the family business. It is hard to make a living as a farmer.
